Our Curriculum

The curriculum at St. John the Baptist School is aligned with the Massachusetts State Standards set by the Department of Education. Our faculty and administration use data from student MAP testing (Measuring Achievement and Growth), which is administered twice a year for students in grades K-2 and three times a year for students in grades 3-8 to further challenge students. Additionally, teachers regularly review the curriculum through the IXL Learning Program.

Our faculty and staff are dedicated to empowering and inspiring every student to strive for excellence, learn with passion, and live with integrity and faith. Recognizing that each child learns in their own unique way, our teachers employ a variety of strategies to help every student reach their personal best.


MAP Testing Results Language Usage & Reading

In Reading, our school is currently ranked overall in the 59th percentile, with high achievement and high growth.


In Language Usage, our school is currently ranked overall in the 69th percentile, resulting in high achievement and high growth.



MAP Testing Results Math & Science

Our Mathematics scores have increased over the past three years with the implementation of Sadlier Progress in Mathematics. Teachers will continue to evaluate and support students in Mathematics up to and including implementation of manipulatives, small groups, Math Club, IXL, Math Shelf, and Rocket Math.

Overall, these results will continue to help us improve our curriculum. Furthermore, it shows a positive reflection of the scaffolding instruction our teachers implement in their classrooms. Our teachers challenge each student with their individual achievement ability.





At St. John's we value the importance of our art program, as it fosters creativity, critical thinking and problem-solving skills, while also supporting emotional development and cultural understanding.



The Band

The Saint John's Band is comprised of thirty one students from grades Kindergarten to eighth grade. Students have the opportunity to study instrumental music on Ukulele, Violin, guitar, Flute, Clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, trombone and drums. The band performs three shows a year, one at Christmas, one at grandparents day, and one in the spring, at the end of the year. Our Athletics

At St. John's, this past year was a shining example of how our strong family culture fuels both growth and success in athletics. From the first whistle to the final buzzer, our student-athletes demonstrated dedication, teamwork, and school spirit that made the entire SJS community proud. Whether it was on the basketball court or during cross country meets, our teams not only competed with heart but also supported one another like family—proving that at St. John's, success is measured not just in wins, but in the character and unity we build along the way.

The Fall season started out with Coach Eric Wade leading our Cross-Country teams into competition. Our Boys Varsity team won the Catholic championship for the third straight year. The team, led by eighth graders Seamus McCarthy, Lucas Sanches, and Christian Sanchez, helped keep the consistency and culture that coach Wade has built in past years. Our Girls Varsity and Junior Varsity teams also had great seasons and strong showings at the league championship meet. The Girls Varsity team were led by Noelle Lander and Bianca Boodoosingh.

The Winter season brought on our basketball teams and renewed the fire and spirit for another season. Our Girls Varsity team, led by Taisha Castillo, Katie Perkins, and Kayla Kolodziej, piled up awards and wins all year long. The Boys and Girls Junior Varsity teams also had great seasons and won playoff games in the process. The Boys Junior Varsity team finished as the NSCESBL regular season champion with only one loss. Coaches Gerald MacKillop and Gerardo Sosa did a fantastic job motivating the team and making sure they were ready to play. Coaches Mike Gioia and Luis Castillo pushed the Girls Junior Varsity team to a great season against very tough competition.
